*Title I School - students are provided an additional half-day of kindergarten beyond what is funded by VBCPS. Because the local operating budget funds half-day kindergarten at all schools, federal funds may only be used to provide services over and above what is in place across the division - to be in compliance with the federal supplement not supplant provision. When full-day kindergarten becomes the standard for elementary schools across the division, Title I federal funding may no longer be used to support these services. The division will not lose any Title I funding as a result of these changes; the funds will simply need to be redirected to other expenditures that are allowable under the federal grant guidelines.

In total, there are 53 elementary schools in the division that offer a kindergarten program (half-day or full-day). Bettie F. Williams ES, Newtown ES and Diamond Springs ES form the Bayside Tri-campus. Of those schools, Diamond Springs is the only one that provides kindergarten. Old Donation School serves students in grades 2-8.
