



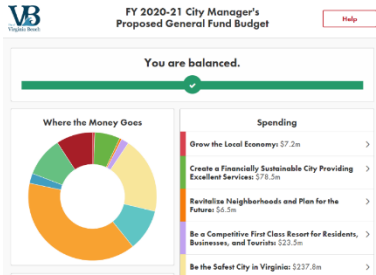

## WAYS TO SHARE THOUGHTS ON THE PROPOSED CITY BUDGET FOR FY 2020/2021

We encourage residents to share their thoughts and suggestions about the budget ([VBgov.com/budget](http://VBgov.com/budget)) that City Council is scheduled to vote on Tuesday, May 12.

**PUBLIC HEARINGS:** Both meetings will be held at the Virginia Beach Convention Center, 1000 19<sup>th</sup> St., to allow for social distancing. The first is Wednesday, April 22, starting at 6:30 p.m. The second meeting will be held on Tuesday, April 28, at 6 p.m. The meetings will be live-streamed on [VBgov.com](http://VBgov.com) or [Facebook.com/CityofVaBeach](https://Facebook.com/CityofVaBeach) and replayed on VBTV. City Council will hold its Reconciliation Workshop on Tuesday, May 5, prior to the vote the following week.

**ONLINE OPTIONS:** In addition to the meetings, citizens can provide feedback using **Balancing Act**, an online tool that lets citizens make changes to the budget, raising or lowering taxes and individual spending items. However, any changes made must still result in a balanced budget. All suggestions will be shared with Council. Try it out at [virginiabeachva.abalancingact.com](http://virginiabeachva.abalancingact.com).



After using Balancing Act, people can try **Taxpayer Receipt** to see an estimate of how much they pay in City taxes and what they get for their money. Anonymously enter age, income, value of a home and car. The program will show an estimate of one's total tax bill and where the money is spent. The tool calculates taxes on real estate and personal property and estimates taxes on restaurant meals and sales based on age and income. ## SUPPORT LOCAL RESTAURANTS

In a show of support and solidarity for our local restaurant industry partners impacted by the suspension of indoor dining in the midst of the Coronavirus pandemic, the **Convention & Visitors Bureau (CVB)** created several online resources to seek take-out meals and curbside food pickup options. With the ability to quickly make in-house edits and additions to the tourism website, [VisitVirginiaBeach.com](http://VisitVirginiaBeach.com), the CVB marketing team researched, created and posted “Take-out Tuesday,” a nationwide push activated on March 24 to support local restaurants during COVID-19.



A new dropdown menu item was added to the main website navigation: Take-Out Options, which offers an updated listing of restaurants from across the city that provide take-out meals and curbside service options. This page includes user-generated content of social posts from local restaurants, breweries, cafes and more.

Within the first hours of posting, more than 230 pageviews were captured. The CVB marketing team will continue to populate this page with business listings that offer take-out and related services and promote via their blog and social channels. The CVB is committed to seeking ways to further raise awareness of how the Virginia Beach community can support the local hospitality industry and will share new information as it becomes available.

### NATIONAL CENSUS DAY IS APRIL 1; COMPLETE YOUR 2020 CENSUS TODAY

Every 10 years (in years ending in zero), the U.S. Census Bureau conducts a census to count every resident in the United States and its territories. Homes across the country should have received instructions for completing the **2020 Census** by now. Once the invitation has arrived at your home, you should respond for every person living in your household in one of three ways: online, by phone or by mail.



The census population count determines how much money the federal government will set aside for schools, hospitals, roads, SNAP, WIC, Medicare, Medicaid and the list goes on. Census numbers are also used to decide how many congressional representatives Virginia can have. The City of Virginia Beach loses \$20,000 over 10 years for each person who is NOT counted. Everyone must be counted to shape the future that we all hope for.

If you don't have the ID number from the instructions mailed to your home, you can complete the form using your address. Virginia Beach is counting on you!

### HOUSING RESOURCE CENTER ACHIEVES LEED® CERTIFICATION

The City’s **Housing Resource Center** recently achieved approval for **LEED® Silver certification** in the new construction category from the U.S. Green Building Council (USGBC). The LEED rating program is an industry standard for excellence in sustainability. To receive



LEED® certification, buildings must meet minimum requirements set by the USGBC. Buildings are awarded points in a variety of categories, including sustainable site choice, energy savings, water efficiency, reduction of CO2 emissions and indoor environmental quality. The Housing Resource Center’s design reduces energy use and wastewater and improves air quality and livability to those who work and reside in the facility.
