### WE CAN'T WAIT: MORE CITY FACILITIES/SERVICES TO REOPEN

More City facilities are reopening to the public very soon, including the Virginia Aquarium, libraries, recreation centers and other buildings throughout the community where City services are delivered.

The **Police Department** and **Emergency Medical Services** are open to the public. All functions and services provided by **Planning & Community Development** are available, including Permits and Inspections. Staff is still accepting submittals dropped off in the building vestibule and online. Call (757) 385-4621 for more information.

### City Treasurer's Office

- All locations are now open to the public except the Lynnhaven Office.

### Virginia Aquarium & Marine Science Center

Opening Friday, June 19, new safety measures have been developed to keep guests, staff, volunteers and animals safe, including:

- Online reservations required for touch-free payment: [tickets.virginiaaquarium.com](http://tickets.virginiaaquarium.com).
- Capacity limited with timed tickets, both for members and general admission
- Guests 10 and older, staff, and volunteers required to wear face coverings (in accordance with Executive Order 63)
- Additional hand sanitizing stations around the Aquarium
- Sanitation procedures increased for high-contact surfaces in the Aquarium
- Reservations not accepted between 1 to 2 p.m. each day to conduct additional thorough cleaning and sanitization
- Other temporary changes: closing the café and snack stand; not offering special programs, behind-the-scenes tours, and scheduled feeding presentations; not hosting private events, summer camps or school programs; and the Virginia Aquarium Giant Screen Theater will be closed.

### Virginia Beach Parks & Recreation

- On Monday, June 22, recreation centers will reopen in two phases for current members, by reservation only, starting with the Great Neck and Princess Anne locations. The other five centers will come online on July 6, provided all goes smoothly with the first phase.
- There will be capacity limits and 10-foot spacing required in exercise areas.
- Online reservations will be required to access the centers and each activity including some group fitness, weight rooms, indoor multipurpose pools, and the gymnasiums for non-contact sports like pickleball and badminton.
- Members will be notified by email of what is available and how to reserve spots.

## Virginia Beach Public Library

- Starting Monday, June 22, library buildings will remain closed, however lobbies and drive-through windows will offer holds pickups at all locations except for the Wahab Public Law Library.
- Customers should not go to the library until they receive an email, text or phone notification from VBPL that their holds are ready.
- Holds pickup service will be offered Monday through Thursday, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m., and Friday and Saturday, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.

## NEW & NOTEWORTHY

### BEACH WATER MONITORING GETS UNDER WAY

The **Virginia Beach Department of Public Health** monitors 22 local beach sites under the **Federal Beaches Environmental Assessment and Coastal Health (BEACH)** Act of 2000, which mandates all coastal states to have beach sampling programs. The 22 sites are monitored once a week from mid-May through September for the presence of Enterococcus bacteria. This type of bacteria is shed by any warm-blooded animals, such as birds, dogs, raccoons, squirrels and humans. It is an indicator organism that does not necessarily make people sick, but when found in high levels, can indicate harmful bacteria or viruses could be in the water.

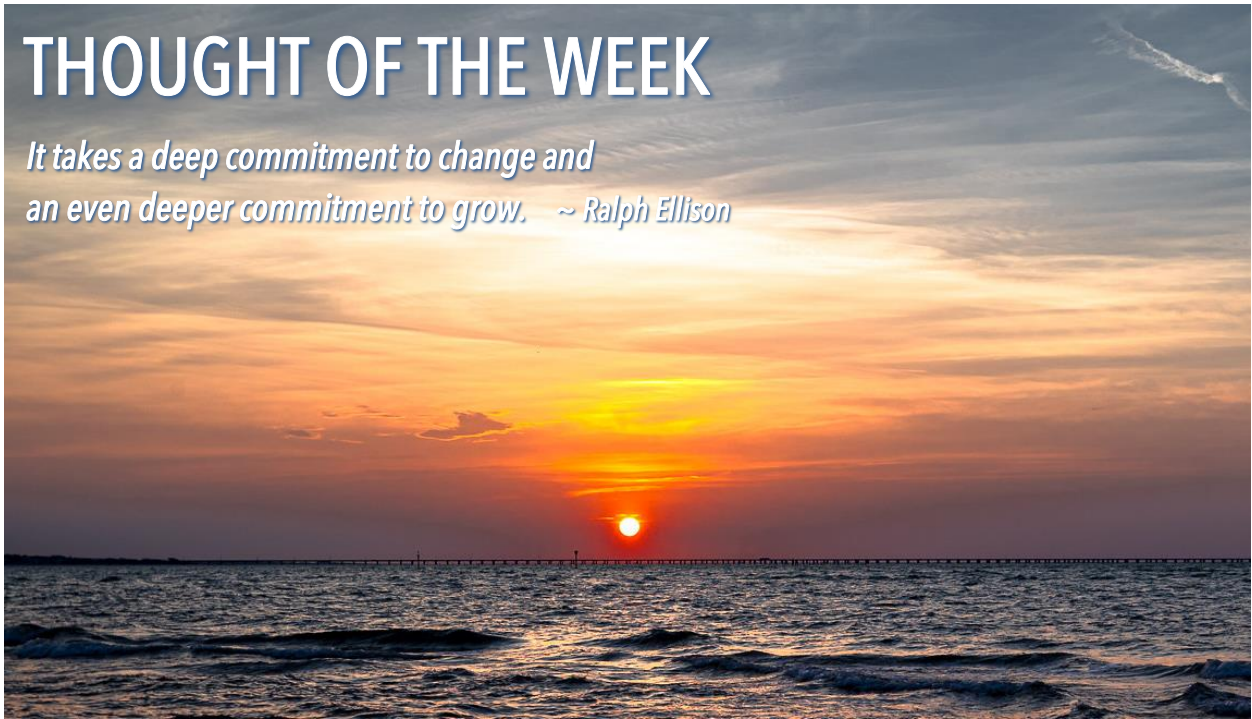


The samples are taken in approximately two feet of water using a pole with a sample collection container attached to the end. A water meter instrument is also used to collect water temperature, turbidity, salinity and dissolved oxygen. Once all the samples are taken, they are delivered to Public Utilities Laboratory for testing. Results of the lab test are typically available within 24 hours. If any water sample exceeds the state water quality standard, the public is notified through a media release and signs are posted to close the section of the beach found to have high levels of Enterococcus. A closed beach prohibits swimming and wading until a resample meets the state water quality standards.

Virginia Beach Public Health works closely with Public Utilities, Police, EMS, Public Works and the Communications Office to ensure the program runs smoothly. Due to the ability to social distance during sampling, the beach monitoring program has been able to continue as normal this season despite the COVID-19 pandemic.
