NAVIGATE TRAFFIC & ADHERE TO HEALTH GUIDELINES DURING LABOR DAY WEEKEND

With Labor Day weekend upon us, people planning to visit the Oceanfront during the last holiday weekend of the summer should expect larger-than-normal crowds. For safety reasons, when the amount of traffic entering the Resort exceeds the capacity in the area, vehicles traveling I-264 eastbound may be diverted at Parks Avenue and redirected westbound on I-264. These diversions, which ease congestion and maintain access for emergency vehicles, could occur anytime between 8 p.m. today, Sept. 4, and 1 a.m. on Sunday, Sept. 6.

When traffic is diverted, the eastbound exit for South Birdneck Road and the westbound exit for First Colonial Road may be closed. Other routes into the Resort Area will remain open: General Booth Boulevard, Virginia Beach Boulevard, Laskin Road and Shore Drive. The City has partnered with [WAZE](#) to provide real-time traffic updates.

As a reminder, health and safety requirements are still in place. People are encouraged to remain vigilant in taking the following precautions:

- Avoid large gatherings of people and sharing living spaces with people outside your immediate household.
- Stay 6 feet apart from others whenever possible; wear a face covering when you unable to maintain that distance and when inside public buildings and spaces.
- Wear a face covering over the nose and mouth while in public, particularly indoors.
- Wash hands frequently with soap and water for 20 seconds; use hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol when soap and water are not available.
- Stay home when sick, except when seeking medical care.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick, including in your home.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth.
- Clean and disinfect touched surfaces frequently.
- Cover coughs and sneezes when not wearing a face covering.

REAL ESTATE AND PERSONAL PROPERTY TAX RELIEF PROGRAM APPLICATIONS DEADLINE EXTENDED; APPLY NOW FOR NEW FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

Applications for the **Real Estate and Personal Property Tax Relief Program** are now accepted through Wednesday, Sept. 30. The program provides direct relief for households where an occupant has lost their employment, had their work hours reduced or has been furloughed due to COVID-19. Any impacted household, whether they have paid their tax bill or not, can apply if they meet the eligibility requirements. OTHER AVAILABLE PROGRAMS

Business Assistance Grants: Applications are being accepted through Sept. 11. To encourage businesses to continue their operations and help mitigate the negative impacts of the pandemic, these grants are intended to provide immediate financial relief for expenses already incurred by the businesses.

Short-Term Mortgage Assistance: Applications are now being accepted for this program that provides eligible households with assistance to help prevent foreclosure of low- and moderate-income homeowners in Virginia Beach who have experienced loss of employment income due to COVID-19. To start the application process, residents must complete a quick, online questionnaire available at VBgov.com/mortgageassistance to see if they meet the initial screening criteria. Residents who are unable to complete the online screening questionnaire should call (757) 385-5750.

Community Organization Grants: Applications are now accepted through Oct. 1. This program provides grant assistance to qualified 501(c)3 non-profit organizations for immediate financial relief for unforeseen expenses due to the global health emergency.

Arts & Cultural Organization Relief Grants: Applications will be accepted through Nov. 15 and reviewed on a rolling basis until funding has been expended. This program provides grant assistance to qualified arts and cultural 501(c)3 non-profit organizations for immediate financial relief for unforeseen expenses due to the global health emergency.

City Services Bill Pandemic Relief Program: Still available and provides financial assistance to qualifying residential customers who need assistance for solid waste collection, storm water, sanitary sewer and water services charges. REMINDER: POLL WORKERS NEEDED FOR UPCOMING NOVEMBER ELECTION

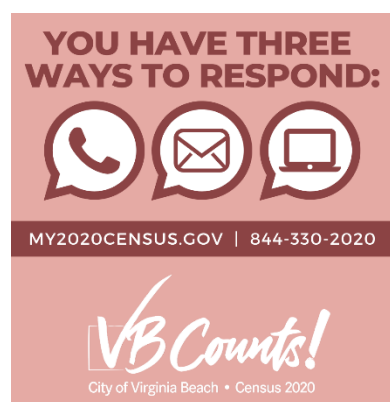

Compensation is \$160.00 and eligible workers will need to attend a 3-hour training class work the polls starting at 5 a.m. Individuals will try to be placed in their voting precinct or one close by.

THERE'S STILL TIME TO COMPLETE THE CENSUS

Every 10 years (in years ending in zero), the U.S. Census Bureau conducts a census to count every resident in the United States and its territories. The **2020 Census** is in the home stretch and will wrap at the end of this month. If you or someone you know has not yet responded, it is urgent that you make sure you do so and help spread the word to friends and neighbors.



Counting every person impacts all of us. The census population count determines how much money the federal government will set aside for schools, hospitals, roads, SNAP, WIC, Medicare, Medicaid and the list goes on. Census numbers are also used to decide how many congressional representatives Virginia can have. The City of Virginia Beach loses \$20,000 over 10 years for each person who is NOT counted. Virginia Beach's response rate is at about 72%. In Hampton Roads, Virginia Beach is second only to Chesapeake which has a 74% response rate, but the goal is to reach a 100% count. Everyone must be counted to shape the future that we all hope for.

If you still need to fill out the census, complete it online at my2020census.gov or call (844) 330-2020 to complete by phone. If you don't have the ID number from the instructions mailed to your home, you can complete the form using your address. Virginia Beach is counting on you!

“FILL THE BOOT” CAMPAIGN GOES VIRTUAL

For over 65 years, America’s firefighters, including the **Virginia Beach Fire Department**, have been hitting the streets in September with boots in hand raising money for the Muscular Dystrophy Association (MDA) through the “**Fill the Boot**” campaign. In the last three years, the VBFD’s Fill the Boot efforts have contributed nearly \$100,000 to the MDA, with last year’s total about \$30,000 alone. This year, due to social distancing requirements, VBFD firefighters will not be out in front of local businesses collecting donations to “fill the boot,” but instead the campaign is going virtual.

In joint support for this campaign, all fire departments in Southside Hampton Roads, along with Williamsburg Fire & Rescue, gathered at Chesapeake City Park earlier this week to record a video public service announcement informing citizens about this year’s virtual “Fill the Boot” campaign. The PSA, proposed by VBFD Captain William J. Raftery and produced by the VBFD’s Multimedia Group, will provide information on the virtual campaign and what the process is for everyone to go online and donate to their local fire department via the MDA website at www.mda.org/ftb.
