

MOBILE VENDING IN THE RESORT AREA

Vending on public property in the Resort Area is only allowable by franchise agreement with the City. All other vending on public property in the RT-1, RT-2, and RT-3 Resort Tourist Districts is restricted by City Code Sections 26-3 and 33-6.

Locations

Mobile vending operations are placed at the corner of the connector park and boardwalk on the following streets: 6th, 8th, 16th, 18th, 20th, 22nd, 24th, and 26th.

Franchise Agreements and Term

Franchise agreements are only granted in 5-year increments. The minimum bid amount is \$5,000 per location. Franchises are granted to the highest bidder that is both responsive and responsible. These agreements are non-exclusive.

Hours and Dates of Operation

Vendors are allowed to operate from May 1 to the Thursday immediately preceding Memorial Day weekend and from the Tuesday immediately following Labor Day to the third Sunday in September, daily from 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

Vendors are required to operate from the Friday immediately preceding Memorial Day weekend to Labor Day, daily from 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. except during inclement weather. Vendors may operate between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 11:00 p.m. No operations can be conducted after 11:00 p.m.

Operational Criteria

A mobile vending operation shall consist of a single, self-contained, one-piece, non-motorized mobile vending unit, which only serves food and beverages. No mobile vending unit can be used for any purpose other than serving foods and beverages. The unit requires approval from the Convention and Visitors Bureau.

1. The mobile vending unit can display a colorful motif with canopies.
2. The mobile vending unit cannot exceed thirty-two (32) square feet of floor space and shall not be over ten (10) feet in height.
3. The unit must be continuously staffed.

4. Food is limited to items contained in the bid response unless otherwise authorized by the City.
5. No item offered for sale can be packaged in a glass container.
6. The prices of all items must be conspicuously posted at all times.
7. The mobile vending unit must contain a receptacle for the deposit of litter, and all litter generated by the operation must be disposed of by the attendant.
8. Overnight storage for the entire vending unit is required at the end of each day.
9. The mobile vending unit must contain a receptacle, approved by the Health Department, for the proper disposal of condensation and drain water.
10. Employees must wear uniforms during all hours of operation.
11. No vehicles other than the mobile vending unit are allowed on the connector park plaza area.
12. Vendors must procure and maintain \$1,000,000 in comprehensive general liability insurance during the entire term of operation. The City must be named as insured under the policy.
