A Resolution to Recognize Human Rights in Virginia Beach

WHEREAS: the City of Virginia Beach recognizes its rich history and our indigenous heritage populations,

WHEREAS: the first immigrants to our nation landed on the shores of Virginia Beach in 1607, and our City is proud of its historic heritage;

WHEREAS: the City of Virginia Beach appreciates that our nation was founded by immigrants, some who came here voluntarily and some who were brought here against their will;

WHEREAS: immigrants have made important contributions to our nation's culture and our City's diversity, and constitute an important part of our community;

WHEREAS: the City of Virginia Beach has historically supported policies that prohibit discrimination based on race, color, ethnicity, sex, age, marital status, national origin, religion, sexual orientation, and disability;

WHEREAS: tourism is an important part of Virginia Beach's economy, and is made possible by the City's acceptance of all cultures and diverse backgrounds.
