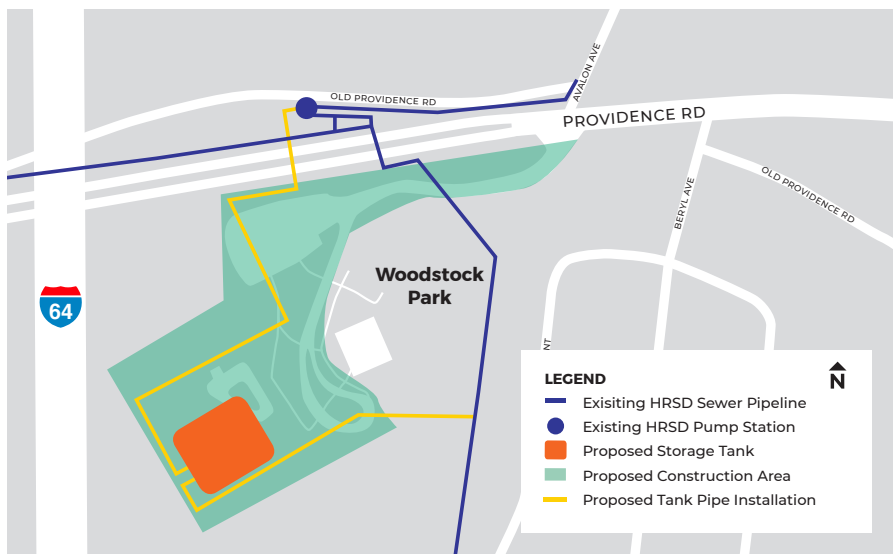


Project Overview

What's happening?

HRSD is constructing a partially buried, 5.2 million gallon offline storage tank in Woodstock Park. An underground storage tank in this area will reduce the risk of sanitary sewer overflows during heavy rain events by temporarily holding conventional wastewater combined with stormwater that migrates into wastewater pipelines until elevated conditions in the pipeline subside.



PROJECT BENEFITS

- The Woodstock Park Improvement Project adds **critical infrastructure** that will help protect public health while preserving and improving Woodstock Park.
- The storage tank will help HRSD reach their **environmental goals** of reducing the risk of sewer spills during large rainfall events.
- The park renovations will be a valuable **community recreational amenity** that will feature interpretive elements to educate park users on the environmental benefits that HRSD brings to the region.

Over the next two years, HRSD will partner with Virginia Beach Parks & Recreation to construct a cutting-edge skate facility on the surface of the tank and complete improvements to the park as a whole including new pavilions, playground equipment, a family restroom, and improved parking. This groundbreaking program will deliver a multi-use facility that serves both Virginia Beach's community needs and the region's infrastructure demands.



What's the schedule?

The park officially closed on June 3, 2019. We expect to complete the storage tank and park improvements in summer 2021.*

What to expect during construction

While construction will be confined to the City of Virginia Beach's Woodstock Park property, you can expect increased traffic from construction vehicles entering and exiting the site on Providence Road immediately adjacent to I-64. In addition, construction outside the park along Barco Drive will take place. Comprehensive traffic control plans will minimize inconvenience.

You can also expect to hear construction noise during normal work hours. City noise ordinances will be followed by identifying and dampening excessive noise-generating activities and equipment.

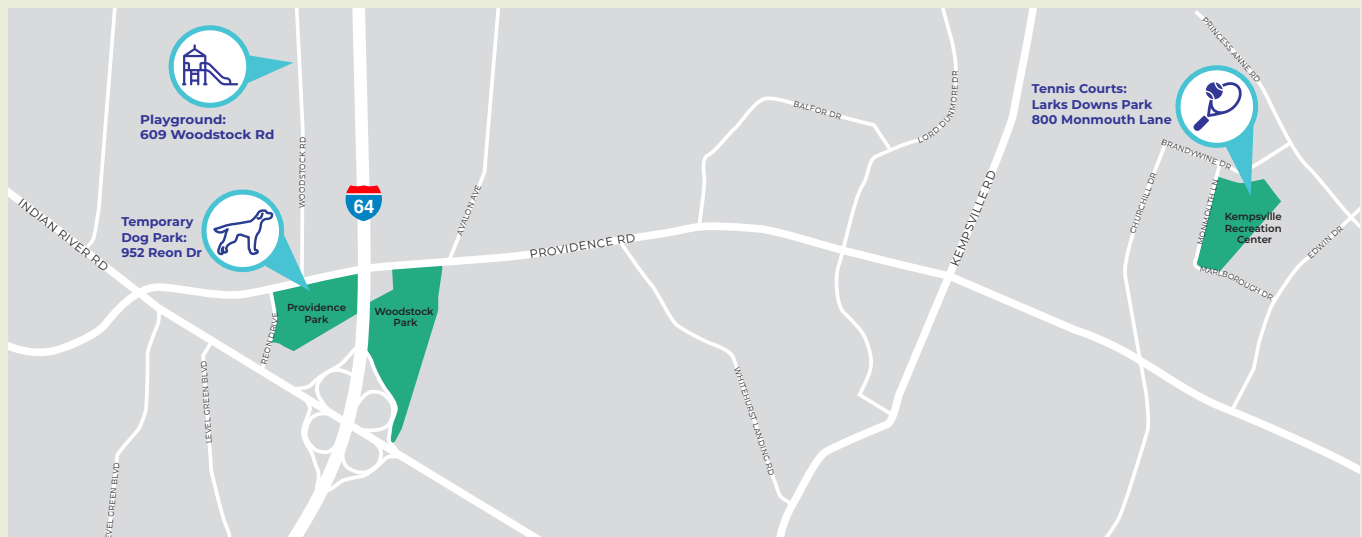
During the park closure, please visit these nearby facilities:
