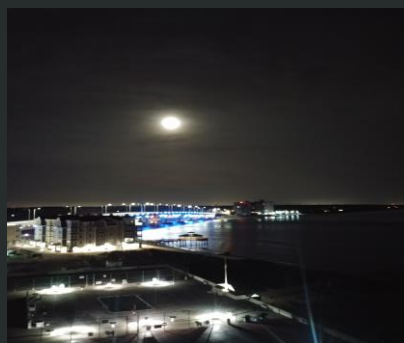

## Voter signup deadline today

Today is the deadline for voters to register, change address or make name changes ahead of the March 3 Democratic Presidential Primary Election.

Virginia voters do not register by party and, if legally registered, may participate in any single party's nominating process on election day. Voters may cast ballots absentee in person until Feb. 29 and by mail until Feb. 25.

At this time, only the Democratic Party has filed with the state to hold a primary election to select its delegates to the party's national convention to nominate a candidate for President of the United States. Fourteen candidates are on the March 3 ballot.

A photo identification – Virginia driver's license or DMV-issued photo ID, U.S. passport, employer-issued photo ID, student identification issued by a Virginia school, college or university; Virginia or U.S. government photo ID (including military) or voter card issued by the Board of Elections – is required.



## Sand replenishment updates given

Public meetings are expected to be held in March covering large-volume sand-replenishment projects for the west side of the Bay beach, Public Works officials told the Bayfront Advisory Commission, and work has begun on several smaller projects.

The major projects include \$3.5 million restoration of Ocean Park beachfront from Rookery Way to the boat ramp. That is expected to begin late this spring after Army Corps of Engineers issues permits for the dredge area supplying the sand, they said. Sand replenishment is expected to return to the Cape Henry Beach in the 2022-23 time frame.

An emergency \$600,000 project to reconfigure the boat ramp area at Lynnhaven Inlet is in the design stage and is being funded through the Parks and Recreation Department capital improvement program.

A \$2.6 million project at Pleasure House Point is expected to be approved soon.

## Bayfront drainage projects gear up

Work is under way for the next phase of the Eastern Shore Drive Drainage Improvement Project, a deepening and widening of the Cape Henry Canal and sanitary sewer mains along the area parallel to Shore Drive between Starfish and Ebb Tide roads.

Another part of this phase will include three new pump stations: off Lynnhaven Drive, Lynnhaven Colony Park and Vista Circle.

The drainage work originally was slated for several years ago, but was rescheduled to coordinate with the Shore Drive Phase III road work between the Lesner Bridge and North Great Neck Road.

## ***Public art sought for Shore Drive-Route 13 gateway***

The city's Cultural Affairs Department, in collaboration with the Bayfront Advisory Commission and other city agencies, is seeking artists to apply for a \$12,800 grant to create a large-scale mural on the Shore Drive overpass at Route 13 to welcome visitors to Bayfront. The successful artist will be notified in May.

Professional artists or artist-led teams are eligible to apply. Applicants must be at least 18 years old, live in the United States and have successfully managed and completed at least one similar commission project with a budget of at least \$3,000. Artists must have previously created large-scale exterior public art projects, carry personal liability insurance during the project and submit to a background check.
