



Virginia Beach Police Department 2019 Neighborhood Survey



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Executive Summary

2019 Survey Responses

Perceptions of crime appear to be highest among the Atlantis Apartment residents. This neighborhood area had the highest percentage of respondents in agreement with six of the eight questions used to assess perceptions of crime and potential for victimization. Atlantis Apartments also had the highest rates for Weapon Law and Drug Violations per 100 address points and had the second highest rates for Part I Violent Crime per 100 address points.

Perceptions of crime also appear to be heightened in the Lake Edward area where respondents ranked second for the highest percentage of agreement with four of the eight questions used to assess perceptions of crime and potential for victimization. The perception of crime in the Lake Edward area is supported by their current crime rates. The neighborhood area ranked highest for property crime rates and are third highest for Part I Violent Crime rates per 100 address points.

Respondents reported drugs being a problem in 9 of the 11 neighborhoods. Pecan Gardens had the lowest percentage of respondents (11.3%) in agreement with the statement “Drugs are a problem in my neighborhood,” and the Atlantis Apartments had the highest percentage of respondents in agreement with this statement (65.8%). These results are consistent with 2018 crime data: Atlantis Apartments had the highest rate of Drug Violations (6.6 per 100 address points), down by 5.2 per 100 address points in 2017. Lake Edward area had the highest percentage of respondents reporting agreement with the statement “Guns are a problem in my neighborhood” (39.1%). The 2018 crime data shows the Lake Edward area had the third highest Weapon Law Violations (1.7 per 100 address points).

At the conclusion of the survey, respondents were asked “Is there anything the Virginia Beach Police Department could do to make you feel safer in your neighborhood?” Through comment analysis, a recurring theme amongst the surveyed areas was the recommendation for “More Patrols”, “More Police Presence” and “Improve Communications Between Police – Citizens – Youth”.



Citizens responded to Question 8 in an open-ended format. Answers were categorized into concerns.




- The top area of concern for Manchester Village residents was “Vandalism” with 9 respondents expressing concern. In 2018, the top area of concern was “Safety and Welfare of Others”.
- Additional areas of concern for Manchester Village residents were “Safety and Welfare of Others”, with 7 respondents, followed by “Noise and Disturbances”, “Traffic Violations or Problems” and “Juvenile Problems”.
- Manchester Village residents were least concerned with “Gang Activity”, “Abandoned and Junk Cars”, and “Trespassing / Loitering” with 0 respondents expressing concern.



- 79.7% of Manchester Village respondents “Strongly Agree” or “Agree” with the statement “I have a positive relationship with the Police Department (VBPD)”. This is a 13.1% decrease from 2018.
- 64.5% of Manchester Village respondents “Strongly Agree” or “Agree” with the statement “People in my community trust the Virginia Beach Police Department”. This is a 21.2% decrease from 2018.

- The highest percentage of agreement (16.5%) amongst Manchester Village respondents was with the statement “I often avoid going out during the NIGHTTIME because I am afraid of crime”. This is a 5.2% increase from 2018.
- The lowest percentage of agreement (1.3%) amongst Manchester Village respondents was with statement “I often avoid going out during the DAYTIME because I am afraid of crime”. This is a 1.7% decrease from 2018.

- 93.7% of Manchester Village respondents answered “Yes” to “I support more officer and citizen involvement in solving problem”.
- 73.4% of Manchester Village respondents answered “No” to the statement “I know one or more of the officers in our community by name or sight”.
- There was no significant change in the answers from respondents when comparing 2018 to 2019.

- From 2017 to 2018, the crime rate per 100 address points increased in Part I Crime Property, Total Part I Crimes and Drug Violations, however, the crime rate per 100 address points for 2016 and 2018 were the same. Weapon Law Violations has remained constant over the years reviewed.
- In contrast with the 2018 decrease in violent crimes, 5.1% of respondents “Strongly Agreed” or “Agreed” with the statement “There is a good chance that I will be a victim of a VIOLENT CRIME in this neighborhood next year.”





When comparing 2018 to 2019 responses there was a reduction in 5 of the 8 “Agree” responses that were not favorable (Q9-Q16) and a decrease in 2 of 2 “Agree” responses that were favorable (Q17-Q18). The most significant reduction was in the perspective that residents have a positive relationship with the Police Department in the Manchester Village area (-13.2 percentage points).



























































































Appendix A

Methodology

In 2019, the Virginia Beach Police Department surveyed ten neighborhood areas: Manchester Village, Scarborough Square, The Oaks, Atlantis Apartments, Emerald Point Subsection, Hill Meadow, Lake Edward, Northridge, Campus East, Green Run Subsection, and Pecan Gardens.

The analysis of survey data includes a summary of responses by area. Consistent with prior years, a door-to-door survey method was used to gather data. Each precinct designated a single night to distribute surveys and uniformed Virginia Beach Police Officers went door-to-door to administer the survey. Survey respondents completed the survey through dictation of their answers to the officers. Completed surveys were entered into a Microsoft Excel spreadsheet at each precinct by a designated Precinct Desk Officer. The resulting Excel files were combined into a single Excel spreadsheet, by a member of the Planning & Analysis Department, to be used for data analysis.

All crime data included as part of the analysis is in IBR format. Due to the dynamic nature of crime data, crime rates are calculated at the time of survey analysis for all three years and may not match rates reported in previous years. Part I Property Crime is comprised of burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft, and arson. Part I Violent Crime includes homicide, rape, robbery, and aggravated assault. At the end of the 2013 calendar year, the FBI broadened the definition of rape to include forcible rape (11A), forcible sodomy (11B), and sexual assault with an object (11C). Figures reported in this analysis reflect the new definition of rape. Total Part I Crime is the sum of property and violent crime. Drug and Weapon Law Violations are evaluated separately and are not included in the total crime rate.

Crime occurring on streets bordering a neighborhood area was included in the crime totals as it would directly impact residents' perception of crime. Crime rates were calculated using address points as of 2018. An address point is defined as a single dwelling unit/household. It should be noted that while an apartment building consists of many dwelling units, it may be counted as a single address point due to limitations of the data. Address point data is provided by the City's Center for Geo-Spatial Information Services. Address points were used because not all the neighborhood areas selected align with Census block groups, making it difficult to provide a reliable population estimate for each neighborhood area.

The door-to-door interview method utilized a convenience sample and may not be an accurate representation of neighborhood area demographics. Generalization of results should be made with caution.
