If you are a victim of credit card fraud or identity theft we suggest you contact the credit bureau and place a fraud alert on your credit account. You will also need to obtain a copy of your credit report and see if there is any suspicious or fraudulent activity on the report. If you find additional fraud on your



credit report contact our office and we will assist you with the proper corrective actions.
