



## BATTERY RECYCLING

- Lithium Ion (Li-On), Rechargeable Batteries, and NiCd batteries CAN NOT go in the trash and MUST BE taken to the Landfill and Resource Recovery Center or to a local retailer such as Lowes, Home Depot, etc...
- Residents and businesses can also visit the Call2Recycle website and enter their zip code to locate a rechargeable battery drop off location near them. <https://www.call2recycle.org>
- The City is not accepting alkaline batteries for recycling via Household Battery Recycling Boxes, which have been removed, or at the Landfill and Resource Recovery Center.
- Alkaline batteries can be tossed in the household trash where they will be collected and transported to a WTE facility. Alkaline batteries no longer contain mercury, which was the primary reason for us accepting them in our HHW program. Alkaline batteries are composed primarily of common metals—steel, zinc, and manganese—and do not pose a health or environmental risk during normal use or disposal.
